

Research interests (in order of importance)

- 1. Producing and publishing articles/books about evo-devo biology, with special attention to a possible existing "correlation" between the development of senses and muscles of face in different vertebrates, and the simultaneous development of internal organs as suggested by comparative anatomical approach applied to research in acupuncture.
- 2. Studying human and comparative anatomical approach in Traditional Chinese Medicine (a book-draft nearly completed, to be revised, exists on the subject).
- 3. Realizing two experiments, relatively simple and low cost, to prove or disprove whether the Acupuncture Meridians System described by Chinese scholars of 1600s exists or not as a micro-electromagnetic structure, with its fulcrum in the Sino Atrial Node, and involved in vertebrate morphogenesis together with—AND INSEPARABLY FROM—the cellular/genetic component.
